The rapid development of new technologies creates both opportunities and challenges for intellectual property regulation. The aim of this issue is to create a comprehensive forum for discussion on the latest developments, legal reforms, and emerging challenges in the field of intellectual property law, with particular emphasis on both EU and national law, including Polish law in particular.

We invite you to submit papers that evaluate, including critically, existing and proposed substantive and procedural law regulations, analyze proposed reforms, or examine the implications of technological changes for more effective enforcement and protection of intellectual property rights.

The issues we are interested in include, among others:

- **Copyright issues in the digital single market** - fair use; the legal situation of authors and performers; related rights of press publishers; liability of online content providers;
- **Current and proposed changes in the area of industrial property law** - analysis of recent reforms, harmonization measures, and future directions in industrial property law (patents, trademarks, utility models, industrial designs, geographical indications, including geographical indications for craft and industrial products);
- **Protection of intellectual property rights in the era of new technologies** - proceedings before European authorities and courts; proceedings before the patent offices, administrative courts, and IP courts; pursuit of non-pecuniary and pecuniary claims;
- **Artificial intelligence and intellectual property law** - issues related to AI-generated works, authorship, licensing, and liability;
- **Regulatory challenges in the Artificial Intelligence Act (AI Act)** - compliance, liability, and implications for innovation and fundamental rights;
- **Enforcement of intellectual property rights in the digital environment** - online infringements, platform liability, and enforcement strategies in the digital age.

We invite you to submit scientific articles written in English or Polish.
