Ondrej Blažo – associate professor in European law specialising in competition law and economic integration, currently Director of the Institute of European Law and Vice Dean of the Faculty of Law of Comenius University in Bratislava, Slovakia. Previously he has been a senior state counsel at the Antimonopoly Office of the Slovak Republic fulfilling duties as case handler and has also been responsible for preparation of legislation (he co-authored several legislative documents on Slovak competition rules) and representation at EU bodies, particularly the Commission's advisory boards and European Competition Network.

Jitka Brodská – diplomat, currently working as Deputy Director of the Human Rights and Transition Policy Department at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic in Prague.
